Explain the main approaches used by judges in interpreting statutes and comment on the usefulness of each approach. [25]

- 3 Describe the jurisdiction of the civil courts and the three-track system. Assess whether these systems have made it easier for the public to use the civil courts. [25]
- 4 Arun is 15 years old and has been found guilty of 4 charges of theft. He has appeared before the Youth Court on three previous occasions for the same offence.

Explain the sentences available to the court and consider the aim of each sentence. [25]

5 Explain how Equity developed and assess its use in modern times. [25]

6 Explain the current roles of barristers and solicitors and comment on whether it is true to say that they now carry out the same functions. [25]
