- 1 (a) (i) Briefly describe what is meant by the term 'myth'. [3]
 - (ii) Briefly describe the way the contents of the Bible are organised. [4]
 - **(b)** Explain what the Trinity teaches Christians about the nature of God. [7]
 - (c) 'Regular services of reconciliation are essential for Christians.'

 - (ii) Briefly describe what it means to say that Muhammad (pbuh) is the Seal of the Prophets. [4]
 - (b) Explain the significance of the concept of Tawhid (unity of God) for Muslims. [7]
 - (c) 'Understanding akhirah (life after death) helps Muslims in their lives.'

 - (c) 'Torah law is relevant even though the world has changed.'
